Our Unit is part of Jaegers' Battalion of Rangers. It is one of the best reenacting units in the field. We portray a military ranger unit. The New York Company also participates in large and small historical sites and battle scenarios. We set up period tents and prepare our food within the time frame of 1755-1763. This time period was called the French & Indian War. In New York the nations of France, Britain and the Iroquois Confederation were struggling to control the whole of the New World. We in Schroth's Company actually use weapons and uniforms typical to that era and recreate actual battles and other experiences in our era.

Each member of our unit strives to maintain a level of competency both with our gear and with our personal attitudes as we relive history. Some members visit schools, community events, historical sites and large-scale reenactments. Members also lecture and write essays & books on the periods we are involved in.

The New York Company has also moved into the Naval interpretation both in the F&I, Rev. War, and the War of 1812. We are the crew of the *Prudence* and the *Nettle*.
